Pack 46 Cub Scouts have many opportunities to enjoy activities that capture the interest of boys yet are fun for the entire family, including siblings. Our Cub Scouts learn essential skills and enjoyment of outdoor activities, community involvement, personal safety, sports, academics and the environment.

Pinewood Derby – Cubs build and decorate 7" pinewood cars and race them down a 25-foot ramp, a classic event that's fun for all.



Sporting Events – Scouts have the opportunity to earn activity patches while having fun watching sporting events like the Monster Trucks & Harlem Globetrotters.

Camping events - In June, Day Camp provides three packed days of fun-filled games, crafts, shows, and activities. In July, the resident Camp at camp Fleishman provides a 3 day / 3 night camp experience for the whole family. Also in July we will hold our pack camping trip.

Service Projects – A few service projects we have done for our community: planted trees, food drives, and served food to homeless families through a program called family promise and more.

Pack 46 is open to all 1st through 5th grade boys regardless of school attended. Our cubs mostly attend Jesse Hall and Alyce Taylor, but a few attend other schools in the area.

Fees – Pack membership is \$27 a year which includes Boy's Life subscription. Membership covers most expenses for the boy throughout the year, including awards, patches, and various materials. Dues of \$2 are paid per week to the den for items used to do achievements, including craft items.

What Pack 46 is Not

Exclusive – *We welcome boys and families of all backgrounds.*

Secularly religious – *Scouting intentionally embraces all religions and offers achievement awards for learning about any of 25 of the world's religions.*

Day care – *You should attend the meetings and events and be with your son. Cub Scouting is generally not a drop-your-son-off activity. Our activities are parent / son oriented. Parents provide our pack and den leadership, and everyone is expected to do their part to help run pack and den activities.*



Achievements and Awards

One of Scouting's biggest benefits is the structured exposure to skills and practical knowledge that can help boys mature in family life, at school and in the community.

The youngest Scouts can earn recognition for achievement in Family, Den, or Go-See-It activities. They participate in all scouting events with an Adult Partner (usually Mom or Dad).

As Scouts grow, they can learn essential skills and enjoyment of outdoor activities, community involvement, personal safety, sports, and the environment. They earn emblems of recognition as they progress throughout the Cub Scout achievements and electives for their age group. All Scouts can also earn recognition for 24 different sports accomplishments including virtually every ball sport plus skating, fishing and swimming.

Academic accomplishment is also very important with recognition of accomplishment in 25 areas including:

Wildlife Conservation

Webelos are the oldest Scouts and can earn 20 pins signifying their proficiency in Physical, Mental, Community, Technology, and Outdoor activities. The Webelos program also prepares boys to join Boy Scouts at the end of fifth grade.
